The concept of the Rapture

The concept of the Rapture, which refers to the belief that followers of Christ will be taken up to heaven in the end times, is not explicitly mentioned in the Christian Bible.

However, some Christians interpret certain passages as referring to the Rapture. According to these interpretations, those who will miss the Rapture are generally described as those who have not put their faith in Jesus Christ as their Lord and Savior. This includes those who reject or deny Jesus, as well as those who simply do not believe in him.

It is important to note that the concept of the Rapture and the specific groups of people who may miss it are matters of interpretation and debate among Christians. Different individuals and groups may have different views on these matters.

- group1: unbeliever they do not believe the scripture like the Pharisee ,

- group 3: The sin of hindering other from believing

1The 14:4-17

4 For we believe that Jesus died and rose again, and so we believe that God will bring with Jesus those who have fallen asleep in him.

15 According to the Lord’s word, we tell you that we who are still alive, who are left until the coming of the Lord, will certainly not precede those who have fallen asleep.

16 For the Lord himself will come down from heaven, with a loud command, with the voice of the archangel and with the trumpet call of God, **and the dead in Christ will rise first.**

17 After that, we who are still alive and are left will be caught up together with them in the clouds to meet the Lord in the air. And so we will be with the Lord forever.

1Cor 15:50-54

2The 2:1-4

Concerning the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ and our being gathered to him, we ask you, brothers and sisters,
