God's Promises in 1 Chronicles

1. 1 Chronicles 1:4 - "Noah, Shem, Ham, and Japheth were the sons of Japheth."
2. This verse lists the descendants of Japheth, one of Noah's sons, and emphasizes God's faithfulness in preserving humanity through the flood.
3. 1 Chronicles 2:3 - "The sons of Judah: Er, Onan and Shelah. These three were born to him by a Canaanite woman, the daughter of Shua."
4. This verse highlights God's grace and mercy in choosing Judah, despite his sinful actions, to be the tribe from which the Messiah would come.
5. 1 Chronicles 4:10 - "Jabez cried out to the God of Israel, 'Oh, that you would bless me and enlarge my territory! Let your hand be with me, and keep me from harm so that I will be free from pain.' And God granted his request."
6. God's promise to bless the tribe of Levi and provide for them:
"The Lord said to Aaron, 'You will have no inheritance in their land, nor will you have any share among them; I am your share and your inheritance among the Israelites. I give to the Levites all the tithes in Israel as their inheritance in return for the work they do while serving at the tent of meeting.'" (1 Chronicles 6:14-15)

6. God's promise to establish David's throne forever:
7. "I will establish his kingdom forever if he is unswerving in carrying out my commands and laws, as is being done at this time." (1 Chronicles 28:7)

9. "The Lord gave David victory wherever he went. David took the gold shields that belonged to the officers of Hadadezer and brought them to Jerusalem. From Tebah and Berothai, towns that belonged to Hadadezer, King David took a great quantity of bronze." (1 Chronicles 18:6-8)
10. God's promise to forgive His people and restore their relationship with Him:
11. "If my people, who are called by my name, will humble themselves and pray and seek my face and turn from their wicked ways, then I will hear from heaven, and I will forgive their sin and will heal their land." (2 Chronicles 7:14)
12. God's promise to provide for His people and meet their needs:
13. "Give thanks to the Lord, for he is good; his love endures forever. Cry out, 'Save us, God our Savior; gather us and deliver us from the nations, that we may give

- thanks to your holy name, and glory in your praise.' Praise be to the Lord, the God of Israel, from everlasting to everlasting." (1 Chronicles 16:34-36)

 15. God's promise to protect and bless His people:
 16. "The Lord is with you when you are with him. If you seek him, he will be found by you, but if you forsake him, he will forsake you. For the Lord your God is gracious and compassionate. He will not turn his face from you if you return to him." (1 Chronicles 16:8-9)
 17. God's promise to provide for His people:
 18. "The Lord will give strength to his people; the Lord will bless his people with peace." (1 Chronicles 16:11)
 19. God's promise to heal His people when they repent:
 20. "If my people, who are called by my name, will humble themselves and pray and seek my face and turn from their wicked ways, then I will hear from heaven, and I will forgive their sin and will heal their land." (1 Chronicles 16:13-14)
 21. God's promise to bless His people with joy and gladness:
 22. "Sing to the Lord, all the earth; proclaim his salvation day after day. Declare his glory among the nations, his marvelous deeds among all peoples. For great is the Lord and most worthy of praise; he is to be feared above all gods. Splendor and majesty are before him; strength and joy are in his dwelling place." (1 Chronicles 16:23-27)
 23. God's promise to establish His covenant with His people forever:
 24. "I will establish my covenant as an everlasting covenant between me and you and your descendants after you for the generations to come, to be your God and the God of your descendants after you." (1 Chronicles 16:17-18)
 25. God's promise to give His people victory over their enemies:
 26. "The Lord will cause your enemies who rise against you to be defeated before you. They shall come out against you one way and flee before you seven ways." (1 Chronicles 18:10)
 27. God's promise to forgive His people when they repent:
 28. "Then David said to God, 'I have sinned greatly by doing this. Now, I beg you, take away the guilt of your servant. I have done a very foolish thing.' The Lord said to Gad, David's seer, 'Go and tell David, 'This is what the Lord says: I am giving you three options. Choose one of them for me to carry out against you.' So Gad went to David and said to him, 'This is what the Lord says: Take your choice: three years of famine, three months of being swept away before your enemies, with their swords overtaking you, or three days of the sword of the Lord — days of plague in the land, with the angel of the Lord ravaging every part of Israel.' David said to Gad, 'I am in deep distress. Let me fall into the hands of the Lord, for his mercy is very great; but do not let me fall into human hands.'" (1 Chronicles 21:8-13)
 29. God's promise to bless His people with skilled leaders:
 30. "All these were descendants of Heman the king's seer. They were given him through the promises of God to exalt him. God gave Heman fourteen sons and three daughters." (1 Chronicles 25:5)
 31. God's promise to provide for His people's needs:

32. "David said to Solomon: 'My son, I had it in my heart to build a house for the Name of the Lord my God. But this word of the Lord came to me: "You have shed much blood and have fought many wars. You are not to build a house for my Name, because you have shed much blood on the earth in my sight. But you will have a son who will be a man of peace and rest, and I will give him rest from all his enemies on every side. His name will be Solomon, and I will grant Israel peace and quiet during his reign.'" (1 Chronicles 22:7-9)
33. God's promise to bless His people with unity and harmony:
34. "So the Levites appointed Heman son of Joel; from his relatives, Asaph son of Berekiah; and from their relatives the Merarites, Ethan son of Kushaiah; and with them their relatives next in rank: Zechariah, Jaaziel, Shemiramoth, Jehiel, Unni, Eliab, Benaiah, Maaseiah, Mattithiah, Eliphelehu, Mikneiah, Obed-Edom and Jeiel, the gatekeepers." (1 Chronicles 15:17-18)
35. God's promise to protect His people from harm:
36. "The Lord said to Satan, 'Very well, then, everything he has is in your power, but on the man himself do not lay a finger.' Then Satan went out from the presence of the Lord." (1 Chronicles 21:12)
37. God's promise to bless His people with wealth and prosperity:
38. "David said, 'My son Solomon is young and inexperienced, and the house to be built for the Lord should be of great magnificence and fame and splendor in the sight of all the nations. Therefore I will make preparations for it.' So David made extensive preparations before his death. Then he called for his son Solomon and charged him to build a house for the Lord, the God of Israel." (1 Chronicles 22:5-6)
39. God's promise to bless His people with wisdom and understanding:
40. "The Lord was with Solomon and gave him great insight and understanding, and breadth of learning as measureless as the sand on the seashore." (1 Chronicles 1:12)
41. God's promise to bless His people with protection from their enemies:
42. "David also defeated the Moabites, and they became subject to him and brought him tribute. Moreover, David also defeated Hadadezer king of Zobah, in the vicinity of Hamath, when he went to set up his monument at the Euphrates River." (1 Chronicles 18:2-3)
43. God's promise to bless His people with leaders who are committed to serving Him:
44. "David said to all the officials of Israel, 'From your own ranks, I have chosen your brother Solomon son of David to be king over Israel.' David said, 'My son Solomon, the one whom God has chosen, is young and inexperienced. The task is great, because this palatial structure is not for man but for the Lord God.'" (1 Chronicles 28:4-5)
45. God's promise to bless His people with a future hope and a plan:
46. "He said to me, 'Solomon your son is the one who will build my house and my courts, for I have chosen him to be my son, and I will be his father. I will establish his kingdom forever if he is unswerving in carrying out my commands and laws, as is being done at this time.'" (1 Chronicles 28:6-7)
47. God's promise to bring His people back from exile:

48. "The Lord, the God of their ancestors, sent word to them through his messengers again and again, because he had pity on his people and on his dwelling place. But they mocked God's messengers, despised his words and scoffed at his prophets until the wrath of the Lord was aroused against his people and there was no remedy. He brought up against them the king of the Babylonians, who killed their young men with the sword in the sanctuary, and did not spare young men or young women, the elderly or the infirm. God gave them all into the hands of Nebuchadnezzar." (1 Chronicles 36:15-17)
49. God's promise to restore His people to their land:
50. "In the first year of Cyrus king of Persia, in order to fulfill the word of the Lord spoken by Jeremiah, the Lord moved the heart of Cyrus king of Persia to make a proclamation throughout his realm and also to put it in writing: 'This is what Cyrus king of Persia says: "The Lord, the God of heaven, has given me all the kingdoms of the earth and he has appointed me to build a temple for him at Jerusalem in Judah. Any of his people among you may go up, and may the Lord their God be with them."'"" (1 Chronicles 36:22-23)
