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God's Promises in 2 Chronicles

1. Wisdom and knowledge - God promises to give Solomon wisdom and knowledge to rule over Israel justly and wisely. "And Solomon said to God, "You have shown great and steadfast love to David my father, and have made me king in his place. O Lord God, let your word to David my father be now fulfilled, for you have made me king over a people as numerous as the dust of the earth. Give me now wisdom and knowledge to go out and come in before this people, for who can govern this people of yours, which is so great?" (2 Chronicles 1:8-10)
2. Blessings - God promises to bless Solomon and his people if they obey His commandments. "If you walk in my statutes and observe my commandments and do them, then I will establish your royal throne, as I covenanted with David your father, saying, 'You shall not lack a man to rule Israel.' But if you turn aside and forsake my statutes and my commandments that I have set before you, and go and serve other gods and worship them, then I will pluck you up from my land that I have given you, and this house that I have consecrated for my name, I will cast out of my sight, and I will make it a proverb and a byword among all peoples." (2 Chronicles 7:17-20)
3. Forgiveness - God promises to forgive the people of Israel if they repent and turn back to Him. "If my people who are called by my name humble themselves, and pray and seek my face and turn from their wicked ways, then I will hear from heaven and will forgive their sin and heal their land." (2 Chronicles 7:14)
4. Protection - God promises to protect the people of Israel from their enemies if they trust in Him. "If my people who are called by my name humble themselves, and pray and seek my face and turn from their wicked ways, then I will hear from heaven and will forgive their sin and heal their land. Now my eyes will be open and my ears attentive to the prayer that is made in this place. For now I have chosen and consecrated this house that my name may be there forever. My eyes and my heart will be there for all time." (2 Chronicles 7:14-16)
5. Presence - God promises to be present with His people if they seek Him wholeheartedly. "If you seek him, he will be found by you, but if you forsake him, he will forsake you. For a long time Israel was without the true God, and without a teaching priest and without law, but when in their distress they turned to the

- Lord, the God of Israel, and sought him, he was found by them." (2 Chronicles 15:2-4)
6. Presence - God promises to be present in the Temple and hear the prayers of His people when they pray towards it. "Then Solomon stood before the altar of the Lord in the presence of all the assembly of Israel and spread out his hands. For Solomon had made a bronze platform five cubits long, five cubits wide, and three cubits high, and had set it in the midst of the court; and he stood on it, knelt down on his knees before all the assembly of Israel, and spread out his hands toward heaven; and he said: "Lord God of Israel, there is no God in heaven or on earth like You, who keep Your covenant and mercy with Your servants who walk before You with all their hearts...Now, O my God, I pray, let Your eyes be open and Your ears attentive to the prayer made in this place." (2 Chronicles 6:12-14, 40)
 7. Forgiveness - God promises to forgive the people when they repent and turn back to Him. "Yet if they repent in the land where they are carried captive, and turn from their sins, and do what is right before You, and confess Your name, and pray and make supplication to You in this temple, then hear from heaven, and forgive the sin of Your people Israel, and bring them back to the land which You gave to them and their fathers." (2 Chronicles 6:38-39)
 8. Provision - God promises to provide for His people when they obey His commandments. "Now if you walk before Me as your father David walked, and do according to all that I have commanded you, and if you keep My statutes and My judgments, then I will establish the throne of your kingdom, as I covenanted with David your father, saying, 'You shall not fail to have a man as ruler in Israel.' But if you turn away and forsake My statutes and My commandments which I have set before you, and go and serve other gods, and worship them, then I will uproot them from My land which I have given them; and this house which I have sanctified for My name I will cast out of My sight, and will make it a proverb and a byword among all peoples." (2 Chronicles 7:17-20)
 9. Warning - God warns Solomon and the people of Israel about the consequences of disobedience. "But if you or your sons at all turn from following Me, and do not keep My commandments and My statutes which I have set before you, but go and serve other gods and worship them, then I will cut off Israel from the land which I have given them; and this house which I have sanctified for My name I will cast out of My sight, and Israel will be a proverb and a byword among all peoples. And as for this house, which is exalted, everyone who passes by it will be astonished and say, 'Why has the Lord done thus to this land and this house?'" (2 Chronicles 7:19-21)
 10. Wisdom - God promises to give Solomon wisdom and knowledge to govern His people justly. "Then God appeared to Solomon by night, and said to him: "I have heard your prayer, and have chosen this place for Myself as a house of sacrifice. When I shut up heaven and there is no rain, or command the locusts to devour the land, or send pestilence among My people, if My people who are called by My name will humble themselves, and pray and seek
 11. Unity - God promises to bless Judah if they remain united and faithful to Him. "But the word of God came to Shemaiah the man of God, saying, "Speak to

Rehoboam the son of Solomon, king of Judah, and to all Israel in Judah and Benjamin, saying, 'Thus says the Lord: "You shall not go up or fight against your brethren! Let every man return to his house, for this thing is from Me.'"

Therefore they obeyed the words of the Lord, and turned back from attacking Jeroboam." (2 Chronicles 11:2-4)

12. Blessings - God promises to bless those who seek Him with their whole heart. "But as for you, be strong and do not let your hands be weak, for your work shall be rewarded!" (2 Chronicles 15:7)
13. Restoration - God promises to restore Judah if they turn back to Him. "Then the Spirit of God came upon Azariah the son of Oded. And he went out to meet Asa, and said to him: "Hear me, Asa, and all Judah and Benjamin. The Lord is with you while you are with Him. If you seek Him, He will be found by you; but if you forsake Him, He will forsake you. For a long time Israel has been without the true God, without a teaching priest, and without law; but when in their trouble they turned to the Lord God of Israel, and sought Him, He was found by them. And in those times there was no peace to the one who went out, nor to the one who came in, but great turmoil was on all the inhabitants of the lands. So nation was destroyed by nation, and city by city, for God troubled them with every adversity. But you, be strong and do not let your hands be weak, for your work shall be rewarded!" (2 Chronicles 15:1-7)
14. Protection - God promises to protect those who trust in Him. "And Asa cried out to the Lord his God, and said, "Lord, it is nothing for You to help, whether with many or with those who have no power; help us, O Lord our God, for we rest on You, and in Your name we go against this multitude. O Lord, You are our God; do not let man prevail against You!" (2 Chronicles 14:11)
15. Salvation - God promises salvation to those who repent and turn back to Him. "So they entered into a covenant to seek the Lord God of their fathers with all their heart and with all their soul; and whoever would not seek the Lord God of Israel was to be put to death, whether small or great, whether man or woman. Then they took an oath before the Lord with a loud voice, with shouting and trumpets and rams' horns. And all Judah rejoiced at the oath, for they had sworn with all their heart and sought Him with all their soul; and He was found by them, and the Lord gave them rest all around." (2 Chronicles 15:12-15)
16. Protection - God promises to protect those who trust in Him. "For the eyes of the Lord run to and fro throughout the whole earth, to show Himself strong on behalf of those whose heart is loyal to Him." (2 Chronicles 16:9a)
17. Deliverance - God promises to deliver those who call upon His name. "Thus says the Lord to you: 'Do not be afraid nor dismayed because of this great multitude, for the battle is not yours, but God's. Tomorrow go down against them. They will surely come up by the Ascent of Ziz, and you will find them at the end of the brook before the Wilderness of Jeruel. You will not need to fight in this battle. Position yourselves, stand still and see the salvation of the Lord, who is with you, O Judah and Jerusalem!' Do not fear or be dismayed; tomorrow go out against them, for the Lord is with you." (2 Chronicles 20:15-17)
18. Healing - God promises to heal those who turn to Him in repentance and prayer. "And in the thirty-ninth year of his reign, Asa became diseased in his feet, and his

- malady was severe; yet in his disease he did not seek the Lord, but the physicians. So Asa rested with his fathers; he died in the forty-first year of his reign. They buried him in his own tomb, which he had made for himself in the City of David; and they laid him in the bed which was filled with spices and various ingredients prepared in a mixture of ointments. They made a very great burning for him." (2 Chronicles 16:12-14)
19. Faithfulness - God promises to bless those who remain faithful to Him. "Thus Jehoshaphat became increasingly powerful by building forts and storage cities in Judah. He had much property in the cities of Judah; and the men of war, mighty men of valor, were in Jerusalem. These are their numbers, according to their fathers' houses. Of Judah, the captains of thousands: Adnah the captain, and with him three hundred thousand mighty men of valor; and next to him was Jehohanan the captain, and with him two hundred and eighty thousand; and next to him was Amasiah the son of Zichri, who willingly offered himself to the Lord, and with him two hundred thousand mighty men of valor. Of Benjamin: Eliada a mighty man of valor, and with him two hundred thousand men armed with bow and shield; and next to him was Jehozabad, and with him one hundred and eighty thousand prepared for war. These served the king, besides those the king put in the fortified cities throughout all Judah." (2 Chronicles 17:12-19)
 20. Prosperity - God promises to bless those who seek Him with all their heart. "Jehoram was thirty-two years old when he became king, and he reigned eight years in Jerusalem. And he walked in the way of the kings of Israel, just as the house of Ahab had done, for he had the daughter of Ahab as a wife; and he did evil in the sight of the Lord. Yet the Lord would not destroy the house of David, because of the covenant that He had made with David, and since He had promised to give a lamp to him and to his sons forever." (2 Chronicles 21:5-7)
 21. Protection - God promises to protect His people from their enemies. "And the Lord set up an adversary against Jehoram, the Philistines and the Arabians who were at the border of the Ethiopians. And they came up into Judah and invaded it, and carried away all the possessions that were found in the king's house, and his sons also, and his wives; so that there was not a son left to him except Jehoahaz, the youngest of his sons." (2 Chronicles 21:16-17)
 22. Blessing - God promises to bless those who seek Him with all their heart. "And he did what was right in the sight of the Lord, but not with a loyal heart. Now it happened after this that Joash set his heart on repairing the house of the Lord. Then he gathered the priests and the Levites, and said to them, 'Go out to the cities of Judah, and gather from all Israel money to repair the house of your God from year to year, and see that you do it quickly.' However the Levites did not do it quickly." (2 Chronicles 24:2-5)
 23. Guidance - God promises to guide those who seek His counsel. "And he sought God in the days of Zechariah, who had understanding in the visions of God; and as long as he sought the Lord, God made him prosper." (2 Chronicles 26:5)
 24. Forgiveness - God promises to forgive those who repent of their sins. "And Amaziah said to the man of God, 'But what shall we do about the hundred talents which I have given to the troops of Israel?' And the man of God answered, 'The Lord is able to give you much more than this.' So Amaziah discharged the troops

- that had come to him from Ephraim, to go back home. Therefore their anger was greatly aroused against Judah, and they returned home in great anger. Then Amaziah strengthened himself, and leading his people, he went to the Valley of Salt and killed ten thousand of the people of Seir." (2 Chronicles 25:9-11)
25. Conquest - God promises to give victory to those who trust in Him. "Uzziah was sixteen years old when he became king, and he reigned fifty-two years in Jerusalem. His mother's name was Jecholiah of Jerusalem. And he did what was right in the sight of the Lord, according to all that his father Amaziah had done. He sought God in the days of Zechariah, who had understanding in the visions of God; and as long as he sought the Lord, God made him prosper." (2 Chronicles 26:3-5)
 26. Prosperity - God promises to bless those who obey Him and seek Him. "Jotham became mighty, because he prepared his ways before the Lord his God. Now the rest of the acts of Jotham, and all his wars and his ways, indeed they are written in the book of the kings of Israel and Judah. He was twenty-five years old when he became king, and he reigned sixteen years in Jerusalem. So Jotham rested with his fathers, and they buried him in the City of David. Then Ahaz his son reigned in his place." (2 Chronicles 27:6-9)
 27. Salvation - God promises to save those who call upon His name and repent of their sins. "Then Hezekiah and all the people rejoiced that God had prepared the people, since the events took place so suddenly. And Hezekiah sent to all Israel and Judah, and also wrote letters to Ephraim and Manasseh, that they should come to the house of the Lord at Jerusalem, to keep the Passover to the Lord God of Israel. For the king and his leaders and all the assembly in Jerusalem had agreed to keep the Passover in the second month. For they could not keep it at the regular time, because a sufficient number of priests had not consecrated themselves, nor had the people gathered together at Jerusalem." (2 Chronicles 30:26-27)
 28. Protection - God promises to protect His people from their enemies. "In those days Hezekiah was sick and near death, and he prayed to the Lord; and He spoke to him and gave him a sign. But Hezekiah did not repay according to the favor shown him, for his heart was lifted up; therefore wrath was looming over him and over Judah and Jerusalem. Then Hezekiah humbled himself for the pride of his heart, he and the inhabitants of Jerusalem, so that the wrath of the Lord did not come upon them in the days of Hezekiah." (2 Chronicles 32:24-26)
 29. Restoration - God promises to restore those who turn back to Him. "And they faithfully brought in the offerings and the tithes and the dedicated things; Cononiah the Levite had charge of them, and Shimei his brother was the next. Jehiel, Azariah, Nahath, Asahel, Jerimoth, Jozabad, Eliel, Ismachiah, Mahath, and Benaiah were overseers under the hand of Cononiah and Shimei his brother, at the commandment of Hezekiah the king and Azariah the ruler of the house of God." (2 Chronicles 31:12-13)
 30. Deliverance - God promises to deliver His people from their afflictions. "Now in the fourteenth year of King Hezekiah, Sennacherib king of Assyria came up against all the fortified cities of Judah and took them. Then Hezekiah king of Judah sent to the king of Assyria at Lachish, saying, 'I have done wrong; turn

- away from me; whatever you impose on me I will pay.' And the king of Assyria assessed Hezekiah king of Judah three hundred talents of silver and thirty talents of gold. So Hezekiah gave him all the silver that was found in the house of the Lord and in the treasuries of the king's house." (2 Chronicles 32:1-4)
31. Forgiveness - God promises to forgive His people when they repent of their sins. "For if you return to the Lord, your brethren and your children will be treated with compassion by those who lead them captive, so that they may come back to this land; for the Lord your God is gracious and merciful, and will not turn His face from you if you return to Him." (2 Chronicles 30:9)
32. Healing - God promises to heal the land and the people if they turn back to Him. "Then they arose and removed the altars that were in Jerusalem, and they took away all the incense altars and cast them into the Brook Kidron. They also removed the wooden images and the carved images and broke down the high places and the altars from all Judah, Benjamin, Ephraim, and Manasseh, until they had utterly destroyed them all. Then all the children of Israel returned to their own cities, every man to his possession." (2 Chronicles 31:1)
33. Provision - God promises to provide for His people when they trust in Him. "But they laughed at the messengers of God, despised His words, and scoffed at His prophets, until the wrath of the Lord arose against His people, till there was no remedy. Therefore He brought against them the king of the Chaldeans, who killed their young men with the sword in the house of their sanctuary, and had no compassion on young man or virgin, on the aged or the weak; He gave them all into his hand. And all the articles from the house of God, great and small, the treasures of the house of the Lord, and the treasures of the king and of his leaders, all these he took to Babylon." (2 Chronicles 36:16-18)
34. Restoration - God promises to restore His people after their time of punishment. "In the first year of Cyrus king of Persia, that the word of the Lord by the mouth of Jeremiah might be fulfilled, the Lord stirred up the spirit of Cyrus king of Persia, so that he made a proclamation throughout all his kingdom, and also put it in writing, saying, Thus says Cyrus king of Persia: All the kingdoms of the earth the Lord God of heaven has given me. And He has commanded me to build Him a house at Jerusalem which is in Judah. Who is among you of all His people? May the Lord his God be with him, and let him go up!" (2 Chronicles 36:22-23)
35. Salvation - God promises salvation to His people through His anointed one, the Messiah. "Now in the first year of Cyrus king of Persia, that the word of the Lord by the mouth of Jeremiah might be fulfilled, the Lord stirred up the spirit of Cyrus king of Persia, so that he made a proclamation throughout all his kingdom, and also put it in writing, saying, Thus says Cyrus king of Persia: All the kingdoms of the earth the Lord God of heaven has given me. And He has commanded me to build Him a house at Jerusalem which is in Judah. Who is among you of all His people? May the Lord his God be with him, and let him go up!" (2 Chronicles 36:22-23)
