God makes several promises to the Israelites. Here are some of the key promises:

28. God's words are not too hard for them to understand and obey, and they have a choice between life and death, blessing and curse (Deuteronomy 30:11-20).
29. God promises that even after Moses' death, He will go ahead of the Israelites and lead them into the land He had promised to their ancestors (Deuteronomy 31:3-6).
30. God will be with the Israelites and will never leave nor forsake them (Deuteronomy 31:6, 8).
31. God promises that when the Israelites cross the Jordan River, He will drive out the nations before them (Deuteronomy 31:3).
32. God promises that when the Israelites are oppressed and cry out to Him, He will hear their cry and come to their rescue (Deuteronomy 31:17).
33. God promises that He will bless Joshua, who will lead the Israelites after Moses, and that He will be with him as He was with Moses (Deuteronomy 31:23).
34. God promises that He will bring the Israelites into the land flowing with milk and honey, which He promised to their ancestors, and that they will be prosperous and multiply there (Deuteronomy 31:20).
