God's Promises in Isaiah

1. God promises to redeem Israel: In Isaiah 1:27, God promises that Zion (which represents Israel) will be redeemed with justice and her penitent ones with righteousness.
2. God promises to give peace: In Isaiah 2:4, God promises to judge between the nations and settle disputes for many people. Then they will beat their swords into plowshares and their spears into pruning hooks. Nation will not take up sword against nation, nor will they train for war anymore.
3. God promises to bless His people: In Isaiah 3:10-11, God promises that the righteous will be blessed, while the wicked will be punished.
4. God promises to heal His people: In Isaiah 6:10, God promises to heal the people of their spiritual blindness and deafness so that they can turn to Him and be healed.
5. God promises to bring salvation: In Isaiah 7:14, God promises to send a virgin who will conceive and bear a son, and they will call him Immanuel, which means "God with us." This prophecy is later fulfilled in the birth of Jesus Christ.
6. God promises to be a refuge: In Isaiah 8:13-14, God promises to be a sanctuary for those who fear Him and a stone that causes people to stumble and a rock that makes them fall for those who reject Him.
7. God promises to forgive: In Isaiah 9:6-7, God promises to send a child who will be called Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, and Prince of Peace. He will reign on David's throne and over his kingdom, establishing and upholding it with justice and righteousness from that time on and forever.
8. God promises to give light: In Isaiah 9:2, God promises to give the people of Israel a great light, and those who walk in darkness will see it.
9. God promises to save His people: In Isaiah 10:21, God promises to save His people, and a remnant will return to the Mighty God.
10. These promises show that God is a loving and compassionate God who cares for His people and desires to bless them with His salvation, peace, and healing.
11. God promises to judge Assyria: In Isaiah 10:5-34, God promises to judge Assyria for their arrogance and wickedness, and to defend Jerusalem from their invasion.
