God's Promises in Joel

The book of Joel contains several promises that God makes to his people, including:

- 1. Restoration: God promises to restore what the locusts have eaten and to make up for the years that have been lost. "I will restore to you the years that the swarming locust has eaten, the hopper, the destroyer, and the cutter, my great army, which I sent among you" (Joel 2:25).

I will restore to you the years that the swarming locust has eaten" (Joel 2:24-25). These promises are still relevant and applicable today for those who put their trust in God.
- 6. Protection: God promises to protect his people from harm. "The Lord roars from Zion and utters his voice from Jerusalem, and the heavens and the earth quake. But the Lord is a refuge to his people, a stronghold to the people of Israel" (Joel 3:16).
- 7. Justice: God promises to judge the wicked and defend the righteous. "Let the nations stir themselves up and come up to the Valley of Jehoshaphat; for there I will sit to judge all the surrounding nations. Put in the sickle, for the harvest is

The Lord answered and said to his people, 'Behold, I am sending to you grain, wine, and oil, and you will be satisfied; and I will no more make you a reproach among the nations" (Joel 2:18-19).
- 9. Repentance: God promises to forgive those who repent of their sins. "Yet even now," declares the Lord, "return to me with all your heart, with fasting, with weeping, and with mourning; and rend your hearts and not your garments." Return to the Lord your God, for he is gracious and merciful, slow to anger, and abounding in steadfast love; and he relents over disaster" (Joel 2:12-13). These promises show God's faithfulness and love towards his people, and they are a source of hope and encouragement for all who trust in him.
