God's Promises in Joshua

In the book of Joshua, there are several promises that God made to Joshua and the Israelites

- 1. The promise of the land (Joshua 1:2-4): God promised to give the Israelites all the land from the desert to Lebanon, and from the Euphrates River to the Mediterranean Sea.
- 2. The promise of victory (Joshua 1:5-6): God promised to be with Joshua and the Israelites and to give them victory over their enemies.
