God's Promises in Judges

The book of Judges in the Bible contains several promises that God made to the Israelites during the time of the judges. Here are some of the main promises:

- 11. Deliverance from enemies: God promised to deliver the Israelites from their enemies when they turned to Him and cried out for help (Judges 3:9, Judges 6:14-16).
