## God's Promises in Numbers

- 1. Promised land: God promised the Israelites that he would give them the land of Canaan as their inheritance (Numbers 1:1-3).
- 2. Multiplication of descendants: God promised to multiply the descendants of Israel and make them as numerous as the stars in the sky (Numbers 1:18).
