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Prayers for Ezekiel

Chapter 1:

Lord God, just as Ezekiel saw a vision of your glory and power, we ask that you reveal your majesty to us as well. Help us to recognize your authority and sovereignty over all things, and give us the courage to follow your commands. Amen.
