Chapter 1:

Chapter 3:

Holy God, we come before you with humble hearts, acknowledging our disobedience and sin. We confess that we have listened to the lies of the enemy and have disobeyed your commands. We recognize that our sin has broken our relationship with you and with one another. But we also remember your promise to send a Savior who would crush the serpent's head and restore our fellowship with you. Help us to turn away from sin and to trust in your mercy and grace. In Jesus' name, Amen.

Chapter 4:

Compassionate God, we lift up to you the story of Cain and Abel and the tragic consequences of envy and violence. We pray for all those who struggle with jealousy and anger, that they would find healing and forgiveness in your love. We also ask for your comfort for all those who have lost loved ones to murder or injustice. Help us to learn from this story and to pursue peace and reconciliation in all our relationships. In Jesus' name, Amen.

Chapter 5:

Eternal God, we marvel at the genealogy of Adam and his descendants, which spans hundreds of years. We are reminded that our lives on earth are but a vapor, and that we must use our time wisely to honor you and serve others. We also remember that death entered the world through Adam's sin, but that life and hope come through faith in Jesus Christ. May we trust in your promises and live with purpose and passion for your kingdom. In Jesus' name, Amen.

Chapter 6:

Chapter 9:
