23:12. If you go a little away and have some remaining national ties with you, and get married to each other,

23:13 Be assured of the word, Yahweh your God will no longer drive them out from your eyes. but they will become your snares, your sins, your scourges, your thorns in your eyes. until you perish in this beautiful land of Jehova your God.

There shall be no other gods before the LORD

Polytheistic worship can lead to fragmentation and confusion of beliefs, making it difficult to focus on one core value or the teachings of God. Focusing on one God can bring inner stability and deep spiritual connection, making it easier for people to understand and practice their faith.

In addition, polytheistic worship can also lead to conflict and confusion in beliefs. Deities may have different teachings and requirements, which can lead to confusion in beliefs and behaviors. Paul's reference to "all things are possible, but not all things are good" also applies to faith, teaching us to distinguish between what is good for our growth, development, and happiness and what is just a waste of time and resources. It emphasizes the importance of rational thinking and in-depth evaluation. Sometimes, in order to pursue a goal or satisfy our own desires, we may be attracted to various temptations, but not all temptations will benefit us well.

Therefore, this quote reminds us to think carefully about our choices and consider the possible consequences of them. It teaches us to make trade-offs when pursuing our goals and enjoying life, to choose those things that are truly beneficial to us, rather than blindly pursuing all the possibilities that appear to us.

In our daily lives, we can take guidance from this phrase to be more deliberate in our choice of course of action, ensuring that our actions and decisions lead to positive effects and benefits for ourselves and those around us.

Jo. 23:1 After a long time had passed and the LORD had given Israel rest from all their enemies around them, Joshua, by then old and well advanced in years,

Jo. 23:2 summoned all Israel — their elders, leaders, judges and officials — and said to them: “I am old and well advanced in years.

Jo. 23:3 You yourselves have seen everything the LORD your God has done to all these nations for your sake; it was the LORD your God who fought for you.

Jo. 23:4 Remember how I have allotted as an inheritance for your tribes all the land of the nations that remain — the nations I conquered — between the Jordan and the Great Sea in the west.

Jo. 23:5 The LORD your God himself will drive them out of your way. He will push them out before you, and you will take possession of their land, as the LORD your God promised you.

Jo. 23:6 “Be very strong; be careful to obey all that is written in the Book of the Law of Moses, without turning aside to the right or to the left.

Jo. 23:7 Do not associate with these nations that remain among you; do not invoke the names of their gods or swear by them. You must not serve them or bow down to them.

Jo. 23:8 But you are to hold fast to the LORD your God, as you have until now.

Jo. 23:9 “The LORD has driven out before you great and powerful

nations; to this day no-one has been able to withstand you. Jo. 23:10 One of you routs a thousand, because the LORD your God fights for you, just as he promised.

Jo. 23:11 So be very careful to love the LORD your God.

Jo. 23:12 “But if you turn away and ally yourselves with the survivors of these nations that remain among you and if you intermarry

with them and associate with them,

Jo. 23:13 then you may be sure that the LORD your God will no longer drive out these nations before you. Instead, they will become snares and traps for you, whips on your backs and thorns in your eyes, until you perish from this good land, which the LORD your God has given you.

Jo. 23:14 “Now I am about to go the way of all the earth. You know

with all your heart and soul that not one of all the good promises the LORD your God gave you has failed. Every promise has been fulfilled; not one has failed.

Jo. 23:15 But just as every good promise of the LORD your God has come true, so the LORD will bring on you all the evil he has threatened, until he has destroyed you from this good land he has given you.

Jo. 23:16 If you violate the covenant of the LORD your God, which he commanded you, and go and serve other gods and bow down to them, the LORD’s anger will burn against you, and you will quickly perish from the good land he has given you.”

Chapter 23 consists of Joshua's final address to the leaders and elders of Israel. In his speech, Joshua reminds them of God's faithfulness to his promises and of the victories that the Israelites have won with God's help.
