Blessing and worship

1 Chronicles 16:23-36

Sing to Yahweh and the earth will sing! Praise His salvation every day! Speak of his glory among the nations!

Tell his wonders among all the peoples!

For the LORD is great, and deserves great praise; He is above all gods and deserves to be feared.

for the gods of all nations are nothing; But the LORD created the heavens.

There is honor and majesty before him, power and joy in his own place.

O all the nations of the people, give glory and power to Yahweh, and to Yahweh!

And thou shalt give him the glory of the name of the LORD, and offer it before him;

Worship the holy and glorious Jehovah. And the whole earth will tremble before him!

The world is firm and unshakable. May the heavens rejoice, and the earth rejoice!

Let it be said among the nations, "The Lord is king." May the sea and all that is in it!

May the field and all that in it rejoice! Then all the trees of the forest shall shout for joy before the LORD,

for he has come to judge the whole earth. Give thanks to the LORD, for he is good.

His mercy endures forever! Say, "O God of our salvation, save us,

Gather us together and deliver us from the nations, that we may glorify your holy name,

To praise you as a boast. Yahweh, the God of Israel, is to be praised,

From eternity to everlasting." And all the people said, "Amen." and praise the LORD.

David's psalms show us that we worship and serve the only true God. We need to know how to give thanks, to cry, to proclaim, to sing, to talk about, to boast in God's name. We need to have faith in God's name and affirm His power to others. We are to seek the face of the Lord with joy, and we are to remember God's marvelous works, to speak of His glory, to praise Him, and to give Him the power of glory.

God chose the Israelites solely on the basis of His sovereignty: the Lord loved you and chose you not because you were more numerous than the other peoples, but because you were the least of all the peoples. because the LORD loved you, and because he kept the oath which he swore unto your fathers" (Deuteronomy 7~8). Thus, God's plan of salvation does not depend on the power, conduct, or piety of the elect, but rather on His "own word, and his own hands" (2 Chronicles 6:15).

God cares for His people immensely. In His care for the Israelites, he showed his infinite love and unfailing concern. If a person turns away from God, he leaves God's protective arm. The woes that would have been avoided will befall him. But not all of humanity's woes are caused by this. Because Satan has permission to persecute the righteous in the great struggle between good and evil, suffering does not necessarily prove forsaken by God.

16:43 "Then all the people returned to their houses, and David returned to bless his family."

We can learn lessons about true family worship from people who return to their families from the pilgrimage. Modern Christians tend to focus too much on the worship life in the church and sometimes neglect the role in the family and society. However, there is no more important and effective way to pass on the true faith to future generations than faith education in the family.

No one has ever been able to completely humble himself before God, completely let go of self-esteem and face, and David's God-centered worship attitude is very worthy of our learning. When we worship God, we magnify the Lord, delight in Him, and center Him throughout our worship.

Although the Bible does not have a very strict form of worship, which gives us a lot of freedom to express our worship to Him according to our own feelings, the most important thing is to remember that the center of worship is God, and worship is to glorify God, and if our worship is not to glorify God, but to glorify ourselves, it will bring a breach to the church. We recognize that many young people today are influenced by the world's trends, and we should pay attention to what can attract people, not necessarily all of them are valuable. Pray that the Lord will help us to worship not to attract crowds, not to catch up with fashion, not to satisfy our own religious emotional needs, but simply to glorify God, and to be an expression of love and gratitude.
