1 Chronicles Chapter 22:

A detailed overview of 1 Chronicles chapter 22

In his old age, David wanted to contribute to the temple of God, and he prepared for it. He settled in Jerusalem and began preparations for the construction of the temple. But God did not allow David to build the temple, only to prepare for it.

22:18 "Now set your hearts to seek the Lord your God, and arise to build the sanctuary of the Lord God, so that the ark of the covenant and the holy vessels of the Lord may be moved into the house built for the name of the Lord." ┘

Set your mind: Even if you want to accomplish the things of the world, you need to be focused and diligent, not to mention how hard you want to do the great gospel work! Therefore, the saints should always remember the words of the Lord Jesus: "Love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your mind" (Matthew 22:37).

Building the temple was not David's personal work, but God's task for the entire people, and it needed to be built by all. Nor can the building of the church be based on the zeal or interest of an individual, but that each person should "seek Jehovah" and "rise up and build." First "seek the Lord" and then "rise up and build."

Serving God is not about doing more and doing great things to be more spiritual, not only to learn to rely on God to do things, but also to learn to obey God and not to do things. No matter how zealous a person is in loving the Lord, he cannot cross God's boundaries. No matter how great one's gifts, one should recognize one's limitations.

David did his best to "prepare materials for the temple," not to cheer his sons on the table, but to do the main work with one accord. Not that the name of man may be exalted, but that the name of God alone may be "exalted"

David himself could not build the temple, so he helped his son prepare all the tools for building the temple. He prepared a lot of gold, silver, copper, iron, cedar wood, and a lot of technicians, including a lot of Gentiles, and the technology and resources that Gentiles have, and so on, and made a lot of preparations for this.

Jesus came to earth, and he literally built the temple. His resurrected body is the true temple. When Jesus came into heaven, His body was still on this earth, making my body a temple.

Now that we have become sons of God, we should not just think, "Now that I have become the son of God, then answer all my prayers, O God." "Don't just think from your own point of view. Since God has entrusted us with the construction of the temple, and now that he is ready for it in heaven, there are countless gold, silver, copper, iron, and angels, so now that the conditions are ready, let us rise up and do our work. God has prepared everything for us. We don't need to be afraid or timid about what the father has prepared for his son, we just need to ask boldly, and the reason why the Internet is developed is also to allow us to work and prepare for the church.

1 Chronicles 22

22:1 David commanded the Gentiles who were gathered together in Israel to send stonemasons from among them to dig out the stones and build the temple of God.

22:2 The Great David prepared a lot of irons, and made a lot of arrows and hammers on the door . and prepared a lot of copper, so much that it could not be called .

22:3 and prepared innumerable cedar wood . For the Sidonians and Tyrans brought to David a great deal of cedar wood.

22:4 "The house that my son Solomon, who is still young and delicate, to be built for Yahweh, must be exalted and glorious, and shall be made glorious and spread throughout all the nations. Therefore I will prepare materials for the temple. So David prepared a great deal of material before he died.

22:5 David summoned his son Solomon, and told him to build a temple for the gods of Yahweh and Israel.

22:6 And he said unto Solomon, My son, in my heart it was my desire to build a temple for the name of Yahohua my God.

22:7 but the words of the Lord came to me , saying, You have shed the blood of many men and fought many great battles . Thou shalt not build a house for my name, for thou hast shed the blood of many before my eyes.

22:8 You are going to have a son . He will be a man of peace . I will keep him at peace from the enemies that surround him. His name will be Solomon . [i.e., the meaning of peace] In the days of his reign I will make Israel peaceful and well-being.

22:9 He will build a house for my name. He will be my Son, and I will be his Father. He is king of Israel, and I will establish his kingdom forever.

22:10 My son, I wish Yahweh and the hwa to be with you, to prosper you, and to build the house of Yahweh and the glory of your God, as he said unto thee.

22:11 May Yahweh grant you wisdom and wisdom, good rulership of the Israelite nations, and the law of Yahweh your God.

22:12 If thou wilt be diligent in the statutes and ordinances which Jehohua commanded Israel through Moses, thou shalt prosper. Be strong and courageous, and do not be afraid, and do not be afraid.

22:13 In the midst of trouble, I prepared for the house of Jehohua a hundred thousand talents of gold, a million talents of silver, and copper and iron, so much that they could not be called. I have also prepared wood and stone, and you may add more.

22:14 You have many craftsmen, stonemasons, carpenters, and all kinds of skilled craftsmen.

22:15 and innumerable gold, and silver, and brass, and iron. you should get up and do things . may ye hwa be with you .

22:16 And David commanded the princes of Israel to help his son Solomon, saying,

22:17 yes hua your god is not with you . didn't you tell you to be safe all around . because he has put the inhabitants of this place into my hands . The land was subdued before Yahweh and his people.

22:18 Now make up your minds and seek Yahweh your God. Let us also build the sanctuary of Yahweh, so that the ark of Yahwehwa and the holy vessels of Yahweh may be brought into the temple that Yahwha is built for the name of Yahwah.
