1 Chronicles Chapter 23:

How should I prepare for the days ahead?

As we age, preparing for the days ahead in God's kingdom means relying more on God's guidance in faith, in heart, and in daily life. Here are some specific suggestions:

But we also need to adjust our ministry to God's adjustments from time to time. Sometimes we are trying to help others, and we should be diligent in helping. There is also a distinction between the importance of the church's ministry. Ask yourself, am I willing to serve faithfully in the smallest of things? Sometimes we may not have the opportunity to serve, sometimes the service we can participate in is so insignificant, and we should not slack off and relax because of this, but still be vigilant and pray, and honor the Lord greatly, because these are God's holy works, and they are all God's holy callings. Let's not think that there are some small things that are not considered to be serving God, in fact, service to God is based on these small things.

As David entered his old age, he began to plan and plan for the future of his kingdom from a dying perspective. David gives us another focus, which is how a nation can perpetuate the faith of worshipping God, doing God's will in worship and pleasing God.

One day, when life enters old age and is about to die, what arrangements do we make? David gives us a good example of focusing on helping our children and grandchildren to worship God better, which is our first and highest priority. As an

older man, David didn't feel like he could do anything for the younger generation anymore. Although David was too old to personally participate in the work of the worship and ministry team. But he used his prestige and influence as an elder to do what he could for the transmission of the faith.

We pray together:

Dear Heavenly Father, thank You for the grace you give us life and each day. As we age, please give us wisdom and strength to help us grow stronger in our faith. Let our hearts always be close to You, relying on Your promises to find true peace and joy. Ask You to guide us to make the right decisions in practical life, whether health, finances, or relationships, that will honor Your name. May our lives be testimonies of Your love, to serve others, and to live as Christ.

Take authority in our house and work so that all our families may come to you, know you, and keep the way of faith until the day we see you. Lord, place the burden of passing on the faith in our hearts, and in the hearts of our children and grandchildren, so that we may be constantly reminded in the gospel that we live for the Lord in this world.

1 Chronicles 23

23:1 And when David was old and full of his days, he made his son Solomon, king of Israel.

23:2 David summoned the leaders of Israel and the priests of Levites.

23:3 The Levites were counted from thirty years of age onwards, and the number of their males was thirty-eight thousand.

23:4 of them were twenty-four thousand, and were in charge of the affairs of the temple of Jeho. 6,000 men were officers and teachers .

23:5 there were 4,000 men guarding the gate . And 4,000 people sang praises of Yahweh with the musical instruments of David.

23:6 David divided the Levitical Gentle, Columbia, and Mirali's sons and grandchildren into shifts.

- 23:7 The sons of Geshun had Radan and Shimei.
- 23:8 The firstborn of Radan: Jehiel, and Zetam and Joel, three men.
- 23:9 And the sons of Shimei were Shilomi, Hazael, and Haran. This is the patriarch of the Banu Ladan.
- 23:10 And the sons of Shimei: Jaha, and Xenah, and Jeush, and Pelia, four men.
- 23:11 Jahab was the firstborn, and Zizah was the second. But there were not many children of Jeusch and Bellia . so it is counted as a family.
- 23:12 The sons of his brother were Amram, Eshar, Hebron, and Uzer.
- 23:13 Amlam's sons were Aaron and Moses. And Aaron and his children set apart, that they might separate the most holy things, and burn incense before Yahweh, and serve him, and blessed him in his name, for ever.
- 23:14 As for Moses the man of God, and his children, the names are written in the books of the tribe of Levi.
- 23:15 Moses' sons were Gershun and Eliezer .
- 23:16 Ge Shun 's eldest son was a fine cloth industry .
- 23:17 Eliezer had no sons of Elihabiah and Eliezer had no other sons . But Lehabiah had many children.
- 23:18 The firstborn son of Ezhar was Shiroman.
- 23:19 The eldest son of Hebron was Jereyah. the second son is amaria . the third son was yahasi . The fourth son was Jekameh.
- 23:20 Uzziel's eldest son was Micah . The second son was Jezeiah.
- 23:21 The sons of Merari were Malari, and the mother revealed, and the sons of Malay were Eliasar and Christ.
- 23:22 Eliazar died, and had no children, but daughters. And the sons of their own people took them as wives.
- 23:23 Mother's sons were Mahali, Edder, and Jerimoth.

23:24 and the sons of Levi who were patriarchs of the fathers, according to the number of males, from twenty years old onwards, did the affairs of the Hoho Temple.

23:25 David said that the God of Yahweh and Israel had brought peace to his people. He dwelt forever in Jerusalem.

23:26 The Levites no longer had to carry the tabernacle and all the utensils used in it.

23:27 As David commanded at his deathbed, all Levites from the age of twenty were counted.

23:28 Their office was to serve the sons of Aaron, to do work in the temple of Jehovah, and in the court, and in the house, and to purify all the holy things, which was the work of the temple of God.

23:29 and to manage the showbread, the fine noodles of the grain offerings, or the unleavened pancakes, or the things that are baked on a tray or mixed with oil, and the various dimensions of the buckets.

23:30 every morning and evening , stand and praise meyer and hua .

23:31 And on the Sabbath day, and at the New Moons, and at the feasts, according to the number of burnt offerings, they offered the burnt offerings to Yahweh.

23:32 And he kept watch over the tabernacle of the congregation, and over the sanctuary, and to keep the service which the Lord Howard commanded the children of their brother Aaron, and to do the service of the temple of Yahweh.

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Some important verses from 1 Chronicles 23:

1. "David made Solomon king in his old age and arranged for the division of office and ministry among the Levites to maintain the worship of the temple." (1 Chronicles 23:1-6)
2. David also prescribed a system of shifts for the Levites, whose tasks included priesthood, singers, gatekeepers, and other service duties. —1 Chronicles 23:6-32.
3. "David taught his son Solomon to faithfully obey God's laws and commands and to manage and protect the temple with all his heart." —1 Chronicles 23:11-32.
4. "David set up for the Levites to have goods for their needs to serve and maintain the temple." —1 Chronicles 23:25-32.
5. "David included the sons of Manasseh in the genealogy of Israel to commemorate their support and contributions to David's dynasty." —1 Chronicles 23:14-17.

First Chronicles 23 records King David's organization and ordination of the Levites so that they could continue to serve God in the temple after it was completed. In this chapter, King David divides the Levites into shifts, each with different duties and tasks, such as guarding the door, singing, waiting, and guarding. King David made meticulous arrangements for the Levites and encouraged them to serve Jehovah wholeheartedly.
