Satan's power will control a place through idols. A breach was formed through fear, and then its altar was erected. But the most important thing is that they will eventually be destroyed.

In verses 11–16, Jeremiah criticizes those who believe in false gods who believe only in their idols and not in the existence and power of the true God. He said that false gods were just manmade false things that could not bring true salvation and salvation. Satan and idols end up being annihilated. Today's Enemy of Christ is the result of these craftsmen who built idols and temples. If we follow the organization of the enemy Christ, we will be destroyed.

[Jeremi10:21] "The shepherds have become animals, and they have not inquired of the Lord."

This is a very serious reproach, and this is the case with how many shepherds who, instead of asking God, lead their flocks astray. So we need to look inwardly to see how much of God's work in the church is hindered by our lack of prayer. Seeking God leads to prosperity, success in work, and an increase in the flock. Prayer is hard work, and the best work in the world is done with simple prayers. When we go into the inner closet and pray behind closed doors, this work is more effective than running outside and doing the holy work, and the best outcome of the gospel is when Peter and John go to Jerusalem to pray for the new believers (Acts 8:14).

In verses 17–25, Jeremiah continues to emphasize the power and wisdom of the true God, who is the Lord of all things and over the natural and human worlds. He called on people not to believe in false gods, as they only bring destruction and death.

10:23 "Yahweh, I know that the ways of men are not up to me; Neither can he that walketh his own steps." We Christians have a Comforter to lead us in the right way, and the more we follow our own path, the more we go and the more we go astray. But the Comforter leads us in the right way, the land that God has prepared for us. Unreliable idols, unreliable money, unreliable skills, rely on the reliable comforter. He moves you to do it, regardless of other people's objections, and He will take full responsibility for you and lead you to your destination. The Holy Spirit comes to cleanse our hearts, and we should comfort Him. God gave us the Comforter to live in us, and when we were left and right, He warned us to walk in the middle.

10 chapters of Jeremiah

10:1 O Israel, listen to what Yahweh and Hua have to say to you.

10:2 Thus saith the Jews, Do not imitate the ways of the nations, nor be dismayed by the heavens. for the nations were troubled by this.

10:3 the customs of the people are empty. They cut down a tree with an axe in the woods, and craftsmen made idols by hand.

10:4 They adorned him with silver and gold, and stabilised him with nails and hammers, so that he could not move.

10:5 He is like a palm tree, made of forged steel, unable to speak, unable to walk, and must be carried by someone. you don't have to be afraid of him . He has no power to bring evil or blessing.

10:6 yes and hua, there is nothing like you. You are a great name with great power.

10:7 Who does not fear you, O King of the kingdoms? It is proper to fear you . for among the wise men of the nations there is no place like thee, though there be honour in power.

10:8 They are all beasts and ignorant . what is the teaching of an image ? The idol is nothing more than a wooden one.

10:9 Pieces of silver, which were brought from Tarshish, and gold from Ufa, were the workmen of craftsmen and silversmiths. and there were blue and purple garments, all of which were the work of craftsmen.

10:10 But Yahweh is the true God, the living God, the eternal King, and when he is angry, the earth is shaken, and when he is angry, the nations cannot bear it. 10:11 Say to them this, It is not the God who made heaven and earth that will be destroyed from the earth and from the earth.

10:20 My tent is ruined, and my ropes are broken. my sons and daughters are gone from me and are gone. No one will put up my tent or hang up my curtain.

10:21 For the shepherds were all animals, and they did not ask Jehovah. Therefore it did not go well, and their flocks were scattered.
