Question: What is blasphemy against the Holy Spirit

Blasphemy against the Holy Spirit comes from a theological concept and is often associated with unpardonable sins. According to the Bible, especially in Matthew 12:31-32, Mark 3:28-30, and Luke 12:10, Jesus warned that blasphemy against the Holy Spirit is "a sin that will never be forgiven."

The sin of blasphemy against the Holy Spirit is considered an extreme rejection of God's salvation, and in Matthew 12:31-32 in the New Testament, Jesus mentions, "Therefore I say unto you, that all sins and blasphemous words of man shall be forgiven; But blasphemy against the Holy Spirit will not be forgiven. and whosoever speaketh against the Son of Man shall be forgiven; But whoever speaketh against the Holy Spirit will not be forgiven in this world or in the world to come." Jesus warns those who see Him perform signs and wonders, but still blame evil spirits for these works, believing that what He is doing is not the work of God, but the work of evil forces. In this case, they are not ignorant or ignorant, but they deliberately reject the revelation of the Holy Spirit and the truth of God.

In Mark 3:28–30, when Jesus cast out demons and performed miracles, some Pharisees accused Him of coming from evil spirits (Beelzebub). Jesus pointed out that such statements are grossly wrong because they know that these miracles are the work of the Holy Spirit, but they deliberately deny and blaspheme the work of the Holy Spirit.

On that day, the Lord Jesus himself relied on the Holy Spirit to cast out demons, and people knew it, but they were hardened, so it was said that he relied on the king of demons to cast out demons. Is this sin the only one that exists on that day? The Lord Jesus came to save people, so everyone who sinned against Him and all other sins can be forgiven. But those who blaspheme the Holy Spirit, who deliberately do not believe and utter blasphemous words, have reached the point of irrepentance, and therefore their sins are unforgivable.
