The difference between God's blessing and personal luck:

Luck is often seen as a fortuitous, positive outcome with no clear cause or controller. It could be "good luck" from a random event, such as finding a parking spot at a critical moment, accidentally dodging a disaster, or stumbling upon a good opportunity. Luck is characterized by its fact that it is not necessarily related to personal effort or faith, but is an unpredictable part of life. Many people will say, "I'm so lucky today!" It's usually an exclamation for some kind of unexpected good. Luck, on the other hand, is seen as chance or luck with no specific source. It is considered to occur randomly and has no specific purpose or significance. People who believe in luck may rely on chance or chance, or even seek feng shui, horoscopes, etc., to change their fate. People who believe in luck may complain about their bad luck in difficult situations. Luck is seen as ephemeral and unpredictable. It is often seen as an accidental acquisition of personal gain. Seen as a random, purposeless accident.

God's blessing is to bring people into an intimate relationship with Him, to experience His grace and peace, and to be a conduit for His blessings to others. While this may include material benefits, the ultimate focus is on spiritual blessings and eternal rewards.

God's blessings come from the true God who created all things in the universe and are given consciously. God's blessings are out of love and grace, benefits that we don't deserve but still receive. Those who believe in God's blessings will know God, rely on Him, obey Him, and give God the glory of success. God's blessings are continuous, and the Bible mentions the word "blessed" hundreds of times. God's blessing is a conscious, purposeful, and ongoing grace. God's blessings are intended to glorify God and bless others. Choosing to believe in God's blessings can lead to a more positive, meaningful attitude towards life.

Proverbs 3 refers to the insight and judgment gained from fearing God and doing His will. It brings life, happiness and peace. Instead of relying on our own limitations, we should seek and cherish the wisdom that comes from God, because it is more valuable than the riches of the world. The five blessings of doing God's will are: longevity and peace, grace before God and man, wisdom, God's direction, physical health, and abundance.

3 My son, do not forget my ^[a]teaching,

And with the first fruits of all your crops (income);

Then your barns will be abundantly filled
And your vats will overflow with new wine.

My son, do not reject *or* take lightly the discipline of the Lord [learn from your mistakes and the testing that comes from His correction through discipline];

Nor despise His rebuke,

For those whom the Lord loves He corrects,
Even as a father *corrects* the son in whom he delights.

Happy [blessed, considered fortunate, to be admired] is the man who finds [skillful and godly] wisdom,
And the man who gains understanding *and* insight [learning from God's word and life's experiences],

For wisdom's profit is better than the profit of silver,
And her gain is better than fine gold.

She is more precious than rubies;
And nothing you can wish for compares with her [in value].

16

Long life is in her right hand;
In her left hand are riches and honor.

Her ways are highways of pleasantness *and* favor,
And all her paths are peace.

She is a tree of life to those who take hold of her,
And happy [blessed, considered fortunate, to be admired] is everyone who holds her tightly.
