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## Proverbs 4

### Parental teachings

The main content of Proverbs 4 is that parents teach their sons to listen to their teachings and memorize their words in order to survive. This underscores the importance of wisdom passed down from generation to generation. Wisdom is considered the most important asset, and parents teach their sons to be wise and wise, and not to forget or deviate from his words. Wisdom guards and protects people. Parents instruct their sons in the way of wisdom and guide them in the way of righteousness. The importance of guarding the heart is emphasized. Proverbs 4:23 says, "Above all, you are to guard your heart, for it is the fruit of life that proceeds from the heart." ### **A Father's Instruction**

4 Hear, O children, the instruction of a father,  
And pay attention [and be willing to learn] so that you may gain understanding *and* intelligent discernment.

For I give you good doctrine;  
Do not <sup>[a]</sup>turn away from my instruction.

When I was a son with my father (David),  
Tender and the only son in the sight of my mother (Bathsheba),

He taught me and said to me,  
“Let your heart hold fast my words;  
Keep my commandments and live.

“Get [skillful and godly] wisdom! Acquire understanding [actively seek spiritual discernment, mature comprehension, and logical interpretation]!

Do not forget nor turn away from the words of my mouth.

Open your ears to my sayings.

Do not let them escape from your sight;  
Keep them in the center of your heart.
